GEOFF PETRIE

President, Basketball Operations

A two-time NBA Executive of the Year award winner, Geoff Petrie has been the key figure behind the success of the Sacramento Kings over the past 16 years.

Under Petrie's direction, the Kings have qualified for the NBA Playoffs in eight of the past 11 campaigns and nine of the past 14 years overall, while winning Pacific Division titles in 2001-02 and 2002-03 and advancing to the 2002 Western Conference Finals. Between 2000-01 and 2004-05, Sacramento joined San Antonio and Dallas as the only teams in the league to register 50-plus wins in each of those years.

When Petrie was named The Sporting News NBA Executive of the Year following the 1998-99 campaign, he became the first person to win both the league's executive and rookie annual awards. Petrie shared the 1971 NBA Rookie of the Year award with Boston's Dave Cowens. Following the 2000-01 season, Petrie was named The Sporting News Executive of the Year for a second time.

Petrie oversees all aspects of the Kings' basketball operations department, including the coaching and scouting staffs, team negotiations and player acquisitions. He also serves as the main basketball liaison between the Kings, the NBA and the league's 29 other teams.

Petrie's eye for talent has been indisputable. He is forever trying to find ways to strengthen the Kings, evidenced by his moves over the last 16 years.

Petrie's re-working of the Kings' roster has come via all avenues of player acquisition. His first-round draft choices have included current Kings Tyreke Evans (2009, #4), Omri Casspi (2009, #23), Jason Thompson (2008, #12), Spencer Hawes (2007, #10), Francisco Garcia (2005, #23) and Kevin Martin (2004, #26), as well as former Kings players Peja Stojakovic (1996, #14), Corliss Williamson (1995, #13), Gerald Wallace (2001, #25), Brian Grant (1994, #8), Tariq Abdul-Wahad (1997, #11), Jason Williams (1998, #7), and Hedo Turkoglu (2000, #16) and Quincy Douby (2006, #19). Meanwhile, his second-round draft selections also have proven to be productive, including Lawrence Funderburke (1994, #51), Michael Smith (1994, #35), Anthony Johnson (1997 #40 overall) and Jerome James (1998, #36 overall) each of whom played at least six NBA seasons.

Petrie also has consummated well over 30 player trades since 1994, highlighted by the 1998 deal, which landed All-Star forward Chris Webber. Additionally, former Kings Mike Bibby, Doug Christie and Brad Miller were also acquired through trades. Of the Kings' current roster, Donte Greene, Jon Brockman, and Sergio Rodriguez arrived in Sacramento via trade.

Petrie has had an enormous amount of success in acquiring players through free agency with the likes of former Kings Vlade Divac, Jon Barry, Vernon Maxwell, Scot Pollard, Jim Jackson, Shareef Abdur-Rahim, Ron Artest and John Salmons. Not only has he exhibited keen skills in bringing in talented players via the draft and free agent signings, Petrie also has achieved success in keeping key players for the future, evidenced by extending the contracts of Martin and Garcia and the re-signing of Beno Udrih to a multi-year pact.

Petrie was the first-ever selection of the Portland Trail Blazers in the 1970 NBA Draft (#8 overall), prior to the club's inaugural NBA campaign. In his first season as a professional, he posted Portland team highs in scoring (24.8 ppg), field goals made (784) and attempted (1,770), free throws made (463) and attempted (600) and assists (4.8 apg).

Petrie's scoring average remains the highest ever by a Portland rookie, while his single-season point total (2,031 pts.) made him one of just eight players in NBA history to surpass the 2,000-point plateau in his rookie campaign. Oscar Robertson and Michael Jordan were the only other guards to achieve the feat (also Wilt Chamberlain, Walt Bellamy, Rick Barry, Elvin Hayes and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar).

Petrie was a two-time All-Star (1971, 1974) and winner of the NBA's 1973 One-on-One tournament, defeating the likes of Gail Goodrich and Bob McAdoo. He still holds Portland single-game records for most field goals attempted (37) and most free throws made (18). He currently ranks sixth on the Trail Blazers' all-time career list in points (9,732), fifth in assists (2,057) and third and fifth, respectively, in field goals attempted (8,719) and made (3,970). A knee injury suffered in his sixth NBA season (1975-76) ended his professional playing career in which he registered averages of 21.8 points, 2.8 rebounds and 4.6 assists per game. His Trail Blazers jersey (#45) was retired by Portland in 1981.

Following his retirement, Petrie worked in private business and beginning in 1984-85 in various roles within the Trail Blazers' front office, culminated by a four-year tenure as the team's senior vice president of operations. He was instrumental in the building of a Portland team that qualified for the 1990 and 1992 NBA Finals, which included the likes of Clyde Drexler, Buck Williams, Jerome Kersey and Terry Porter.

A 1970 graduate of Princeton University, Petrie earned consecutive All-East and All-Ivy League honors following each of his final two collegiate seasons under legendary Tigers head coach and former Kings' Assistant Coach Pete Carril. The team captain as a senior, Petrie ranks seventh on the school's all-time scoring list (1,321 pts.) and fourth among career scoring average leaders (19.9 ppg).

Petrie and his wife, Anne-Marie, reside in Sacramento. He has three children, son, Mike and twin daughters, Anne-Marie and Susanne and three grandsons, Preston, Griffin, and Palmer. Petrie enjoys working out, playing golf and tennis and playing guitar in his spare time.

WAYNE COOPER

Vice President, Basketball Operations

Wayne Cooper is entering his 32nd year in the NBA and his 16th with the Sacramento Kings organization. Cooper has served as the club's vice president, basketball operations since July of 1996. He was promoted to his current position after working two seasons as the club's director of basketball services/assistant coach. He came to Sacramento in July of 1994 following two campaigns in the Portland Trail Blazers' front office.

Cooper helps oversee the day-to-day operation of the Kings' basketball operations department under the direct guidance of President, Basketball Operations Geoff Petrie. In addition to scouting collegiate, professional and international talent, he is in charge of preseason scheduling and overseeing the club's collegiate player data base.

Cooper enjoyed a 14-year playing career in the NBA after being selected by the Golden State Warriors in the second round (#40 overall) of the 1978 NBA Draft. During his professional playing career, Cooper served stints in Golden State (1978-80), Utah (1980-81), Dallas (1981-82), Portland (1982-84 and 1989-92) and Denver (1984-89), posting career averages of 7.9 points, 6.2 rebounds and 1.56 blocks per game.

Cooper played collegiately at the University of New Orleans (1974-78) under Head Coach Butch Van Breda Kolff, earning 1978 Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year honors after averaging 18.1 points and a conference-high 12.7 rebounds during his senior campaign. He finished his career as the No. 2 shot blocker (183) and third-leading rebounder (920) in school history. He was inducted into the UNO Hall of Fame in 1988 and the Louisiana Association of Basketball Coaches Hall of Fame in 1992. Cooper was listed among Sports Illustrated's Top 101 Most Influential Minorities in Sports in 2003 and 2004.

He and his wife, Denise, live in Granite Bay and have three daughters, Lauren, Andrea and Courtney.



JASON LEVIEN

Team General Counsel/Assistant General Manager

Jason Levien enters his second season with the Kings as team general counsel/assistant general manager. Levien's primary responsibilities include drafting and management of players, coaching and management contracts, assisting in salary cap planning and analysis and overseeing team compliance with all NBA rules and procedures. He also assists in scouting while reporting directly to President of Basketball Operations Geoff Petrie and Vice President of Basketball Operations Wayne Cooper.

Levien, a former NBA player agent, represented more than a dozen NBA players over the past decade, guiding his clients through their careers which included navigating the NBA Draft process, free agency and contract negotiations. His clients included Luol Deng (Chicago Bulls), Udonis Haslem (Miami Heat) and the Kings' Kevin Martin.

Having traveled the globe evaluating basketball talent, Levien represented a number of international players drafted into the NBA and professional basketball players in more than 15 countries. He developed a reputation for finding talented players that were either overlooked or flew under the radar.

Levien has also spent time working in politics, including serving as the speechwriter for the Keynote Address at the 2000 Democratic National Convention and in The White House.

Levien is a graduate of Pomona College in Claremont, where he was a member of the basketball team. He served as an editor of the Michigan Law Review while earning his law degree and master's in public policy from the University of Michigan. Levien was later awarded a fellowship at Harvard Law School.

PAUL WESTPHAL

Head Coach

Paul Westphal begins his first year as the head coach of the Sacramento Kings, becoming the 23rd head coach in Kings' franchise history. Westphal brings 22 years of coaching experience at both the professional and collegiate levels to the Kings bench. He spent last season (2008-09) as the executive vice president of basketball operations for the Dallas Mavericks after spending the previous campaign as an assistant coach for the Mavericks (2007-08).

Westphal's NBA coaching experience began nearly five years after his career as a player in the league ended. He coached one season at Phoenix's Southwestern Baptist Bible College and two seasons at Grand Canyon College, guiding them to the 1988 NAIA National Championship. In 1988, Westphal joined the Suns' bench as an assistant coach and four years later, in 1992, the

California native became the franchise's head coach. As head coach, he led the Suns to three of their most successful seasons. In 1992-93, he became the winningest (.756) rookie head coach in NBA history as the Suns clinched the Pacific Division title, won a franchise-record 62 games and made their second appearance in the NBA Finals. In 1995, Westphal became the second-fastest coach to reach 150 wins, accomplishing the feat in just 208 games and just five shy of the mark set by Phil Jackson. The Suns surpassed the 55-win mark in each of Westphal's three seasons.

Westphal remained in Phoenix as the assistant coach to Terry Kearney at Chaparral High School to see his son, Michael, to graduation. He returned to the NBA coaching ranks in the lockout-shortened 1998-99 campaign, leading the Sonics to a 25-25 record. The following season, Seattle posted a 45-37 record and made the playoffs, losing 3-2 to the Utah Jazz in a first round series.

Overall, Westphal's NBA head coaching record stands at 267-159, and his .627 winning percentage ranks among the league's best.

Prior to joining the Mavericks, Westphal served as the head men's basketball coach at Pepperdine University from 2001 to 2006. During his five seasons at Pepperdine, Westphal guided the Waves to an overall 76-72 mark (.514), including a 38-32 (.543) record in West Coast Conference (WCC) play. During the 2001-02 season, the Waves enjoyed a 22-9 record, a share of the WCC title and an at-large berth in the NCAA Tournament.

Westphal began his NBA career when he was a 1972 first-round (10th overall pick) draft choice of the Boston Celtics after graduating from USC. His NBA career spanned 12 seasons, which included stints with Boston, Phoenix, New York and Seattle. He earned a 1974 championship ring with the Celtics and played for Phoenix in the 1976 NBA Finals. In Game 5 of the 1976 Finals, against his old team the Celtics, Westphal's innovative idea to call a timeout when Phoenix didn't have any helped set up the game-tying play to force a third overtime.

During the 1982-83 season, while playing for the New York Knicks, Westphal was named the NBA Comeback Player of the Year after recovering from two surgeries for a broken foot that shortened his two previous seasons.

A five-time All-Star (four with Phoenix and once with Seattle), Westphal's career ended with Phoenix in 1983 after he scored 12,809 points (15.6 ppg), grabbed 1,580 rebounds (1.9 rpg), delivered 3,591 assists (4.4 apg) and came up with 1,022 steals (1.2 spg) in 823 career games. He also was named to the All-NBA First Team three times (1976-77, 1978-79, 1979-80) and All-NBA Second Team once (1977-78). Westphal scored 9,564 points as a member of the Suns and his No. 44 jersey was retired by the franchise on April 15, 1989.

Born in Torrance, Calif., Westphal was the 1968 California Interscholastic Federation Player of the Year as a senior player for Aviation High School in Redondo Beach. After graduating from Aviation, Westphal played three seasons at USC (freshmen weren't allowed to play on the varsity), earning All-Pac-10 honors in all three, including two First Team selections. He helped lead the Trojans to a 24-2 mark in 1971. USC retired Westphal's jersey number 25 and he was inducted into their Athletic Hall of Fame on May 17, 1997. The Pac-10 also honored Westphal, electing him to the Pac-10 Hall of Honor on March 15, 2008.

Westphal and his wife of 37 years, Cindy, have two grown children. Victoria (Mrs. Branden Higa) and Michael (who recently married the former Leanne Duckgeischel). They have one grandchild, Kai Higa.

JIM EYEN

Assistant Coach

Entering his first season with the Kings as an assistant coach is Jim Eyen. An 18-year veteran NBA assistant coach, Eyen spent the past six seasons as an assistant coach for the Los Angeles Clippers. With 30 years of coaching experience under his belt, Eyen originally began his career with the Clippers in 1988 when he served as an assistant coach under then head coach Don Casey. The following season, he moved to the Lakers, assisting Pat Riley and was retained when Mike Dunleavy was named Lakers' head coach in 1990. After three seasons with the Lakers, Eyen followed Dunleavy to Milwaukee, where he remained through 1996.

In 1997, Eyen again joined Dunleavy, only this time in Portland, where he worked as an assistant through the 2000-01 campaign. When Dunleavy was named head coach of the Clippers prior to the 2003-04 season, he again asked Eyen to join him as the team's lead assistant.

Eyen also served as acting head coach on April 12, 2005, guiding the Clippers to a 94-85 victory over the Utah Jazz at STAPLES Center while Dunleavy was away from the team for personal reasons.

Eyen began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Santa Barbara City College in 1979 where he helped lead the Vaqueros to the state tournament three consecutive years. In 1982, Eyen was named head coach of Dos Pueblos High School in Goleta, Calif., and led his team to the 1984 CIF playoffs as well as coaching the county all-star team. Prior to joining the Clippers' bench in 1988, Eyen served as an assistant for his alma mater, the University of California at Santa Barbara for four seasons, helping the Gauchos earn their first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Eyen's basketball interests also extend internationally. He has served as a consultant to clubs in the Netherlands, Germany and Japan, where in 1996 he worked with the Japanese National Team.

Eyen received a bachelor's degree in Communications Studies from UCSB in 1979, where he also played basketball. He earned a master's degree in Education from Azusa Pacific University in 1984.

Eyen and his wife, Britt, have two children, Joe and Lena, and a dog, Willy.



MARIO ELIE

Assistant Coach

Mario Elie begins his first season as an assistant coach for the Kings. He is a 11-year NBA veteran who spent the past two campaigns as an assistant coach for the Dallas Mavericks. During the 2006-07 season, Elie served as a pre- and post-game host for the Houston Rockets' FOX Sports Net telecasts after serving as an assistant coach for the Golden State Warriors for two seasons (2004-05 & 2005-06). Prior to joining the Warriors coaching staff, he spent the 2003-04 season as an assistant coach with the San Antonio Spurs.

Elie enjoyed a successful NBA playing career averaging 8.6 points, 2.8 rebounds and 2.6 assists in 732 regular season games with Golden State, Philadelphia, Portland, Houston, San Antonio and Phoenix. He also played in 116 career playoff contests, winning three NBA Championships with Houston (1994 & 1995) and San Antonio (1999).

A native of New York City, Elie enjoyed some of his finest playing moments as a member of the Houston Rockets. He started all four games of the 1995 NBA Finals against Orlando, averaging 16.3 points, 4.3 rebounds and 3.3 assists en route to winning his second consecutive title. Additionally, his best individual season came in 1996-97, when he averaged 11.7 points, 3.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists in 78 games for the Rockets. In 1998, he was named to the Rockets 30-Year Team as one of the top 10 players in club history.

After being drafted in the seventh round by the Milwaukee Bucks (160th overall pick) in 1985 out of American International College – a Division II school in Springfield, Mass. – Elie played in Portugal, Argentina, Ireland, the USBL, the WBL and the CBA before making his NBA debut with the Philadelphia 76ers in December 1990. After appearing in three games for the 76ers, Elie signed a 10-day contract with Golden State on Feb. 23, 1991. Five days later, he signed a contract with the Warriors through the end of the following season.

Elie and his wife, Gina, are the parents of triplets, Gaston, Glenn and Lauren. Gina is a television personality who has most recently worked as a national correspondent for MSNBC and as a nightly news anchor for KTRK-TV in Houston. Elie, who earned a degree in human relations, speaks Spanish, Portuguese and French.

DID YOU KNOW ... Kings Head Coach Paul Westphal coached current Sacramento Mayor Kevin Johnson for four seasons (1992-93 - 1995-96) in Phoenix and also coached Hall of Famers Charles Barkley and Patrick Ewing.

LEONARD "TRUCK" ROBINSON **Assistant Coach**

Leonard "Truck" Robinson enters his first season with the Kings as an assistant coach after spending last season as a scout for the Washington Wizards. Though Robinson has never before coached in the NBA, having worked with a number of NBA players and teams over the years, he has been regarded as a specialist in working with big men and has been active in scouting and Big Man training.

Known for his tenacious rebounding and offensive firepower as a player, standing at only 6-7, Robinson, an 11-year NBA veteran, averaged 15.5 points and 9.4 rebounds per game over 772 contests with Washington (1974-77), Atlanta (1977), New Orleans (1977-79), Phoenix (1979-82) and New York (1982-85).

A two-time NBA All-Star (1978 and 1981) and an All-NBA First Team selection (1978), Robinson led the NBA in rebounding in the 1977-78 season, grabbing 15.7 boards per contest, becoming the first true forward to lead the league in that category in 20 years. He helped the Bullets win the 1975 NBA Eastern Conference and was an integral player for Phoenix when the Suns won the 1981 Pacific Division. He led the NBA in minutes played (3,638), rebounds (1,288), defensive rebounds (990), and rebounds per game (15.7) during the 1977-78 season.

Robinson was selected in the second round of the 1974 NBA Draft by the Washington Bullets out of Tennessee State University.

In his 11 NBA seasons, Robinson amassed 11,988 points and 7,267 rebounds.



PETE CARRIL **Assistant Coach**

Pete Carril returns to the Kings' coaching staff as an assistant coach after spending last season as a basketball consultant. One of the most respected men in basketball, Carril enters his 12th overall campaign with the Kings. He spent nine years as an assistant coach (1996-97 to 2005-06). Carril departed the bench for the 2002-03 season, taking on a new title and new role as special assistant to president, basketball operations. However, the coach in him won out as did the Kings, as Carril resumed his daily coaching duties with the club the following season (2003-04) through the 2005-06 campaign.

In a crowning achievement to his legendary collegiate coaching career, Carril was rewarded with an induction into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on September 29, 1997. After coaching 30 years in the NCAA ranks, Carril joined the Kings prior to the 1996-97 campaign. His addition to the Kings' coaching staff reunited him with Petrie, whom he coached at Princeton from 1968-70.

The winningest coach in Ivy League history (525-273, .658 winning percentage), Carril's career at Princeton included 13 conference titles, 11 NCAA Tournament appearances, and just one losing season. Prior to his retirement following the 1996 NCAA Tournament, he was the only active NCAA Division I head coach to reach the 500-victory plateau without athletic scholarships.

In his final season as head coach at Princeton, he led the Tigers to the Ivy League Championship with a 22-7 record. In one of the most thrilling moments of the 1996 NCAA Tournament, Carril's Tigers upset defending champion UCLA in the first round, 43-41, on a signature Carril-designed backdoor layup with only 3.8 seconds remaining in the game.

Carril played collegiately at Lafayette College under Head Coach Butch Van Breda Kolff. Following his graduation from Lafayette in 1952, Carril began his coaching career at the high school level where he stayed for 12 years. He went on to become head coach at Lehigh University for one season before beginning his stay at Princeton in 1967.

Carril is the proud father of two children, son Peter and daughter Lisa, as well as two grandchildren. He enjoys going on long walks and playing tennis.

DID YOU KNOW ... On February 21, 2009, Princeton University named the game floor of Jadwin Gym "Carril Court" in honor of Kings Assistant Coach Pete Carril, who coached at Princeton for 29 seasons (1967-68 - 1995-96).



SHAREEF ABDUR-RAHIM

Assistant Coach

Shareef Abdur-Rahim begins his second season as an assistant coach for the Kings, upon recently retiring a 12-year NBA career as a player due to a recurring knee injury. In his new role, one of his main responsibilities is to work extensively with frontcourt players.

Selected by the Vancouver Grizzlies (now Memphis) as an undergraduate out of California with the third overall pick of the 1996 NBA Draft, Abdur-Rahim's NBA career has spanned 12 seasons with four different teams (Vancouver 1996-97 to 2000-01, Atlanta 2001-02 to 2003-04, Portland 2003-04 to 2004-05 and Sacramento 2005-06 to 2007-08), amassing career averages of 18.1 points (.452 FG%, .297 3FG%, .810 FT%), 7.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game in 830 contests. He averaged 20 or more points and seven or more rebounds

in five consecutive seasons. Abdur-Rahim was a member of the gold-medal winning United States Olympic team in 2000 while still with the Vancouver Grizzlies. He also was selected to the Eastern Conference NBA All-Star Team in 2002.

On December 28, 2002, Abdur-Rahim became the sixth-youngest player in NBA history to reach the 10,000-point plateau at age 26, trailing only Kobe Bryant, Bob McAdoo, Shaquille O'Neal, Michael Jordan and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar with that distinction. He scored a career-high 50 points versus Detroit on November 23, 2001, becoming the first Hawks player to hit that mark since Dominique Wilkins poured in 52 points in 1991.

Abdur-Rahim has a long-standing history of community service involvement. He was named by *The Sporting News* as the NBA's Number 1 Good Guy for 2004 after funding the Reef House in Atlanta through his Atlanta-based Future Foundation with the purpose of assisting at-risk and underprivileged youth.

Abdur-Rahim and his wife Delicia live with their seven-year-old son, Jabri Shareef, and five-year-old daughter, Samiyah.



BRYAN GATES

Assistant Coach

Bryan Gates begins his first season as an assistant coach with the Kings upon a highly successful career as a head coach in the NBA Development League with the Idaho Stampede.

Gates is a two-time recipient of the Dennis Johnson D-League Coach of the Year award (2006-07, 2007-08), having spent the past three seasons as the head coach for Idaho where he compiled a record of 101-51 (.664 winning percentage), including winning the NBA Development League Championship in 2007-08. In all, Gates worked 12 seasons with the Stampede, serving as either the head coach or as an assistant coach with the club since its inception, and has also coached for the IBA's Rapid City Thrillers, CBL's Hickory Nutz, USBL's Oklahoma Storm, and the Beirut Blue Stars in Lebanon.

Gates and his wife Robin live in Sacramento.



BUBBA BURRAGE

Advance Scout

Bubba Burrage begins his 16th season with the Kings and his ninth as the Kings' primary advance NBA scout. He has served five years as an assistant coach/advance scout with the Kings. The 38-year-old native of Oxnard, Calif., spent his first four seasons with the team as video coordinator before splitting time as the team's video coordinator and advance scout for two seasons.

His duties as advance scout require him to travel throughout the country to watch the Kings' upcoming opponents and prepare a detailed scouting report on the upcoming opposition. The scouting report, along with individual and team breakdown video prepared by the Kings' video department, allow the coaching staff to formulate an overall game plan for that opponent. Burrage will also oversee the group of regional advance scouts the Kings will utilize this

season on a game-to-game basis.

Burrage graduated with a journalism/public relations degree from Cal Poly (San Luis Obispo) in 1993, where he was a starting forward for the Mustangs' basketball team. JERRY REYNOLDS **Director, Player Personnel**

In his 25th season with the Kings organization, Jerry Reynolds serves as the club's director, player personnel. He was named to the position in July of 1994 after serving two seasons as the team's general manager. Reynolds is responsible for keeping abreast of both the professional and collegiate talent pools available to the Kings, while also helping to oversee the club's scouting efforts.

Reynolds, who wears many hats within the organization, retired from his post as general manager of the WNBA's Sacramento Monarchs following the 2003 season. In his six seasons as the club's general manager, the Monarchs qualified for the league playoffs four times. Reynolds was a member of the USA Basketball Women's Senior National Team Committee for the 2001-04 quadrennium, where he helped select the coaching staff and players of the Olympic gold medal-winning USA Senior National Teams.

Reynolds is also a member of the Kings Broadcast Network talent team, working as a color analyst for all the club's televised contests.

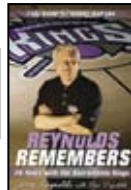
A native of French Lick, Indiana (where he is often referred to as the second most popular local, first being NBA Hall of Famer Larry Bird), Reynolds has a unique understanding of the interaction among players, coaches and the front office due in part to his experience gained through his varied roles with the Kings organization. He originally joined the club in 1985 as an assistant coach responsible for advance pro and college scouting.

On two occasions Reynolds served as the Kings' head coach following midseason changes. In 1987, he was named, on an interim basis, to replace former Head Coach Phil Johnson. The following year he took over for Bill Russell with 24 games remaining and stayed on as the club's head coach for the next two seasons. All told, Reynolds served as head coach of the Kings for a portion of four seasons (1987-1990). He also served as the director of player personnel for two seasons (1990-92) before accepting the role as the club's general manager (5/92-12/93).

An extremely popular figure with both the Sacramento community and the national media, Reynolds is an often-requested favorite on the public speaking circuit. A graduate of Oakland City University (Indiana) in 1966, he received his master's degree in physical education from Indiana State University in 1970.

Reynolds and his wife, Dodie, reside in Roseville and have a daughter, Danielle, a graduate of Santa Monica College and son, Jay, a 1992 graduate of Sacramento State University.

SCOTTY STIRLING **Director, Scouting**

A veteran of the professional basketball ranks for more than three decades, Scotty Stirling brings a wealth of NBA knowledge and professional sports expertise to the Kings' basketball operations staff.

Having worked in the Kings organization for the past 23 years, Stirling is in his 21st season as the club's director of scouting. In his current role, Stirling is responsible for coordinating the club's collegiate scouting efforts.

Prior to joining the Kings, Stirling served as vice president and general manager of the New York Knicks from January 1986 through May 1987. For three seasons (1982-85) he held the position of vice president of operations with the NBA where he supervised referees, administered rule implementation, supervised game scheduling and headed the league's collegiate scouting service.

From 1976 through 1982, Stirling was the assistant to the president of the Golden State Warriors, responsible for the club's day-to-day operation and player personnel decisions. He also was the general manager of the Oakland Oaks of the American Basketball Association when the team won the 1968 ABA title.

Stirling's pro sports experience included five seasons with the Oakland Raiders of the National Football League, first as the club's assistant general manager, then as the general manager, working closely with current Raiders owner Al Davis. In his final year with the club, the Raiders won the AFL Championship and met Green Bay in Super Bowl II.

A graduate of the University of San Francisco, Stirling earned a master's degree from Adelphi University. Stirling resides in Newark, California, with his wife, Pam.

KEITH DRUM **Regional Scout**

Keith Drum is in his 15th season as a regional scout for the Kings. His responsibilities include collegiate scouting and player evaluation. Additionally, Drum is part of the Kings' training camp and NBA Draft preparation staff. Prior to his tenure with the club, Drum served in a similar capacity with the Portland Trail Blazers (1989-90 - 1994-95). While in Portland, Drum worked with current Kings basketball operations staff members Geoff Petrie and Wayne Cooper.

Before joining the NBA scouting ranks, Drum worked 20 years in newspaper journalism. He spent three years as a college basketball writer for United Press International and was a staff member of the Durham Morning Herald (N.C.).

MIKE PETRIE **Regional Scout**

Mike Petrie enters his fourth season as a Kings regional scout after working the previous three seasons as the Kings' video scout. Prior to being the video scout, Petrie spent three seasons as the Kings' assistant video coordinator. The 33-year-old native of Lake Oswego, Oregon, will scout all college and all NBA approved games and tournaments related to the team's ongoing current and future draft preparations. Petrie also assists with scheduling the team's pre-draft workouts, forming the Kings summer league team, and roster evaluation.

Petrie graduated with a speech communications degree from Oregon State University in 2000. He and his wife, Traci, reside in Rocklin with their sons, Preston and Griffin.



ANDREA GRACIS **International Scout**

Andrea Gracis enters his fourth season as the Kings' international scout. His primary role is to scout and evaluate players in the European leagues. Prior to joining the Kings, Gracis worked as a consultant for Interperformances, a full-service agency specializing in the representation of professional athletes. In addition, Gracis worked as a manager and scout for Benetton Treviso, the same club in which he served as captain in the last three years of his playing career before retiring from professional basketball in 1997.

Gracis has almost two decades of playing experience in the Italian First Division, having won three Italian Championships (1987-88, 1989-90, 1996-97), three Italian Cups (1985, 1990, 1995), one European Cup (1995) and one Italian Super Cup (1997). Voted as MVP of the 1990 Playoffs, Gracis was also the best three-point and free throw shooter in the 1990-91 regular season. A 93-time Italian National team selection, Gracis won the silver medal at the 1991 European Championship, as well as the gold medal at the 1982 World Military Championship.

Gracis was born and raised in Treviso, Italy where he currently resides with his son Alessio (20) and daughter Martina (17).



LAFAYETTE "FAT" LEVER **Director of Player Development**

Lafayette Lever enters his third season with the Kings as director of player development after years of being involved with NBA-based programs such as NBA Cares and Legends of Basketball.

As the team's player development director, Lever is responsible for helping younger players with the transition from college to the NBA. As part of his duties, Lever helps coordinate with NBA representatives of the Rookie Transition Program (RTP) in which a team's draft selections travel to New York to help acclimate them to the league. Lever also works on the Kings' broadcast team as a studio co-host.

An 11-year NBA veteran, Lever, who was originally selected by the Portland Trail Blazers in the first round of the 1982 NBA Draft (11th overall) out of the Arizona State, was considered one of the league's best point guards in the late 80's while playing for the Denver Nuggets.

Lever played two years for the Trail Blazers before being traded to Denver prior to the beginning of the 1984-85 season. He enjoyed a six-year career with the Nuggets in which he finished as the franchise's leader in all-time steals and second in career assists. Lever's best year, statistically, occurred during the 1988-89 campaign when he averaged 19.8 points, 9.3 rebounds and 7.9 assists per game for Denver.

Lever's last three NBA seasons were spent playing for the Dallas Mavericks (1990-92 and 1993-94). He amassed career averages of 13.9 points, 6.0 rebounds, 6.2 assists and 2.22 steals per game in 752 outings. Lever is one of only three players in NBA history to record 15-plus points, rebounds and assists in a single playoff game (the others being Jason Kidd and Wilt Chamberlain). He played in two NBA All-Star Games (1988 and 1990) and was selected to the All-NBA Second Team in 1987 and All-Defensive Second Team in 1988.



TRAINING STAFF



PETE YOUNGMAN

Athletic Trainer

Pete Youngman is in his 14th season as athletic trainer of the Kings. The Rochester, New York native spent three seasons as the club's assistant to former Head Trainer Bill Jones before accepting the head post in June of 1996.

In addition to being responsible for every aspect of the Kings' training room operations, Youngman works closely with the team's professional medical staff in the monitoring of a player's physical condition as well as the diagnosing and treatment of injuries. He also is responsible for coordinating all team charter flights and ground transportation.

Youngman joined the Kings after spending the previous nine years with the Boston Red Sox professional baseball organization at all levels of their minor league system.

Youngman graduated from Ithaca College in 1986. He is certified by the National Athletic Trainers Association, a certified performance enhancement specialist as well as a corrective exercise specialist by the National Academy of Sports medicine and is a member of the National Strength and Conditioning Association.

He enjoys running in his spare time and has completed 15 marathons.



MANNY ROMERO

Assistant Athletic Trainer/Performance Enhancement Specialist

Manny Romero begins his fourth season as the Kings' assistant athletic trainer/performance enhancement specialist and his seventh overall with the organization.

His main responsibility is to assist athletic trainer Pete Youngman in all areas, including injury management, injury prevention, injury rehabilitation and emergency procedures on the court as well as serving as liaison between the doctors, team and players.

Prior to joining the Kings, Romero worked seven seasons as a part of the Los Angeles Lakers training staff. During his time with the Lakers, he also worked at a high school outreach program through three different hospitals (Daniel Freeman, Orthopedic and USC). 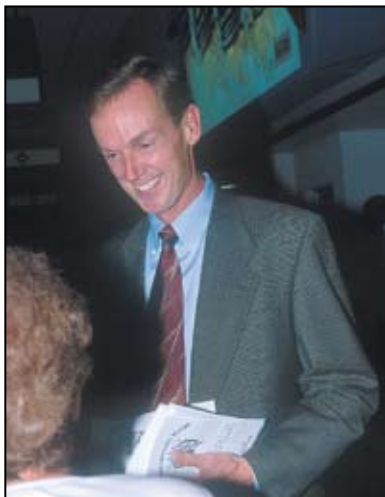
JOHN THOMAS
